Ski Trip:

Mitford is excited to offer a ski trip to Norquay for the whole school! Over 100 students have signed up! Due to the huge response, it will now be over two days with grade 7/8 going on April 6th and grade 5/6 going on April 7th

Grade 6 PATs:

Alberta Education is proceeding with PATs for grade 6 in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Families will be given unlimited access to exambank.com in the next few weeks as a support for students. It is important to note that this form of assessment will be rather new to students so teachers will be working with them using many supports including exambank.com as well to support students so they are feeling comfortable and confident with the assessment.

Grade 7 & 8 Final Assessments:

With life beginning to return to normal we want to do our best to support our grade 7 and 8 students with the opportunity to experience and practice year end assessments. More details about these assessments and the June dates for them will be shared in coming weeks.

Grade 8 Transition:

BVHS will be coming to Mitford to share a presentation about the exciting transition to high school life. The tentative date will be March 14th during the school day. Transition events for parents and families are yet to be confirmed. Stay tuned.

Outdoor Education Building:

Mitford School has received tacit approval for an outdoor education building! This building is hoped to be constructed in April with the goal of housing 30 to 35 mountain bikes and our 70 pairs of snowshoes. The purpose would be to provide new opportunities for students and their teacher to easily access these for daily physical activity and/or their CTF courses such as Outdoor Education, Active Living! Mitford will be submitting a request to FOM for financial support for the purchase of the mountain bikes. Mitford School is funding the cost of the building

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with the construction being a collaboration between the RVS Building and Maintenance dept and the RVS Building Futures program.

7. Report from Board of Trustees

2021/2022 Budget Adjustment

The Board received an update on the 2021/22 budget and approved \$8.63 million of additional spending. The budget adjustment is a result of changes to government funding due to new funding model, additional targeted grants from government, as well as changes to expenses due to higher-than-expected enrollments and the COVID-19 pandemic. This adjustment reduces projected year-end operating surplus (reserves) to just under 4% which is within the range recommended by the Auditor General. Highlights of the new spending include:

- \$3.55 million in additional resources for schools
- \$3.65 million in facilities maintenance and enhancements
- \$650,000 for efficiency improvements
- \$500,000 for teacher release time for curriculum implementation support
- \$300,000 for enhancing the division's cybersecurity position.

Draft K-6 Curriculum

In mid-December, government announced changes to the implementation timeline for the new K-Gr 6 curriculum. It is now expected that three subject areas – English Language Arts & Literature, Mathematics, and Physical Education & Wellness – will be implemented in September 2022. Content continues to be refined based on feedback from Albertans and is expected to be shared with teachers and school authorities in the spring. These are tight timelines and as a Board, we are concerned with the additional pressures and work this puts on staff and teachers at a time of limited resources (people and dollars) and challenges due to the ongoing impacts of teaching and learning in a pandemic. Budget 2022

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We anticipate government tabling Budget 2022 in the legislature on February 24th. Once provincial grant funding is known, RVS will begin to develop the school division budget for the 2022/2023 school year. This process involves many pieces – grant funding, enrolment projections, cost projections, school/bus fees, spending priorities, and more! Budget development starts in Feb and culminates at the end of May when the budget is presented to the Board for their consideration.
