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# **Principal Report for School Council 02 MAY 23**

**Student Population**: 322

**Projected 2023-24 Classes**: Grade 5 French Immersion (1 class), Grade 5 (two classes), Grade 5/6 (One Class), Grade 6 (three classes), Grade 7 (three classes), Grade 8 (three classes) Total 2023-24 Projected School enrolment: 343

#### **Welcoming French Immersion to Mitford School:**

Mitford is excited to welcome French Immersion students to the Mitford family. French Immersion families have been invited to Mitford on May 11<sup>th</sup> at 6:30PM. We know this decision generates many questions for parents. Mitford School is working with Glenbow and RVS to begin the process of transitioning and welcoming the FI Glenbow students to their new school. This includes required staffing, and resources to ensure a great beginning for the program at Mitford.

#### **Grade 8 Farewell:**

We have an amazing number of parents that have come forward to plan and support the Grade 8 Farewell. The theme chosen by the students is 'Starry Night'. The Grade 8 farewell Ceremony will be June 20<sup>th</sup> at 6Pm followed by a dance. The Friends of Mitford have donated \$500 for the Grade 8 Farewell.

#### **Home Reading Initiative:**

As part of our literacy focus within the Mitford Workbook (School Improvement Plan), a home reading program is being developed. It will begin with grade 5 with additional grades added over time. Grade 5 French Immersion will be included in the Home Reading Program. Resources are being purchased and consultation with schools currently running successful programs are underway.

### Earth Week Cross-Curricular School-Wide Project

Mitford's school-wide cross-curricular project during Earth week was a successful learning segue! Students were highly engaged and enjoyed the break in routine to tackle learning applying a different approach that incorporated meaningful applications of their learning to everyday life. Mitford will continue to explore ways to enhance this experience for students in the coming year with the expectation of expanding it to a full week. This learning adventure still addresses the required learning outcomes for each grade just in a different way.

#### Mental Health Success Coach

A Mental Health Success coach (from Steppingstones for Mental Health in association with Rocky View Schools) will be based in Mitford School for the remainder of the school year and for 2023-24. The mental Health Success will provide weekly programming in classrooms and/or small groups, as well as activities such as learn at lunches, whole school programming for events such as Pink Shirt Day or Mental Health Awareness Week, staff wellness activities, and be able to connect with students to provide space and guidance in stress management and emotional regulation. While MHCB Steppingstones to Mental Health does not provide individual counselling, our coaches often work to create calm spaces in their core schools where students can regulate and build connections, including connecting them with community supports.

#### Addictions and Mental Health Presentations (Grade 6-8):

An RVS Addictions and Mental Health worker will be visiting grade 6, 7, and 8 classes to share a presentation related to addictions and mental health. Mitford School welcomes this additional support to share information with students to foster learning on topics that are impactful for youth.

- -There was a community request regarding RVS policy on locking school doors.

As a board a decision was made to have the Superintendent implement new safety measures.

- -k-8/9 all school doors will be locked at all times, working on implementing tech to have staff be able to unlock doors remotely, such as cameras etc. (Beginning as soon as possible)
- -Highschool levels will continue to have doors unlocked, which is a standard across the province.
